focus on Lent

Lent is the 40 weekdays from Ash Wednesday to Easter. We remember that Jesus spent 40 days in the wilderness fasting and praying, while being tempted by the devil. We begin Lent with Ash Wednesday, when Christians receive ashes on their foreheads in the sign of the Cross. These ashes are the burned palm leaves from the previous year's Palm Sunday. This reminds us to "Remember that we are dust and to dust we shall return." This solemn day signifies humility, mortality, and the acknowledgement of our human frailty. We recognize that we need God every minute and are encouraged to develop a more disciplined, intimate and authentic prayer life. As we prepare spiritually to celebrate Easter, we reflect on our lives, confess our sins, and seek repentance. What is repentance? "A regretful acknowledgement of sin with a commitment to change." Sin separates us from God. As we contemplate what our Lord did for us on the cross, we realize the enormity of his gift to us. Not only are we cleansed from sin, but we are freed from shame! Instead of setting our own selfmotivated New Year's Resolutions, perhaps we would do better to listen for God's leading. God's lead might be more difficult than any resolution, and we realize we cannot do His will by our own strength. In 2 Corinthians 12:8 Paul is told by the Lord, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." So, as we reflect, pray, and listen for God's guidance, we strengthen our spirituality and grow closer to God. That is what Lent means to me.

Fat Tuesday—

Before we enter Lent on February 14th (Valentine's Day) we fortify ourselves with a special meal. Once again Chetek Lutheran will provide a meatball, mashed potatoes, gravy, vegetable and dessert meal! On Tuesday, February 13th beginning at 4:30 you can purchase a meal for \$10.00 by following the signs to our drive through, where your takeout meal will be delivered right to your warm car.
